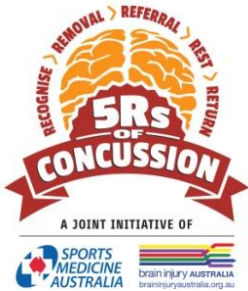


Concussion in Sport Forum

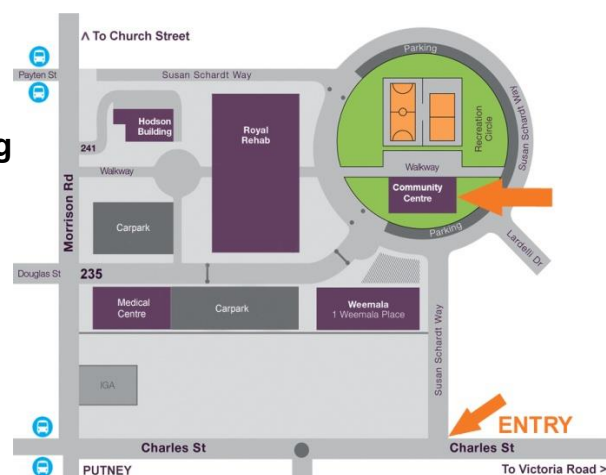

Kerry Goulet

Co-Founder of Stopconcussions.com

Kerry is a former European ice hockey player, coach and general manager. Founded in 2011, Canada-based stopconcussions.com is a not-for-profit organisation dedicated to educating players, coaches, parents and sports administrators about the causes and consequences of concussion.



Keith Primeau

Co-Founder of Stopconcussions.com

Keith is a 15-year veteran of North America's National Hockey League - widely considered to be the premier professional ice hockey league in the world - who sustained four documented concussions, the last of which forced him into an early retirement from play.



Dr. Sharron Flahive

Chief Medical Officer, NSW Waratahs Super Rugby Team

Dr. Flahive is a specialist sports medicine consultant who gained her fellowship of the Australasian College of Sports Physicians in 2004 and was awarded the College Medal for highest achievement in the fellowship exams. She was also the first female sports physician to be appointed to a professional rugby union team in 1999 when she joined the Waratahs.



Dr. Clayton King

Medical Director, Brain Injury Unit, Royal Rehab

Dr. King is a rehabilitation physician, who has worked for more than 20 years with patients and families who have been affected by brain injury. Dr. King is responsible for the Brain Injury Rehabilitation Service for Inpatients and Community at Royal Rehab. In 2003, Dr. King initiated the Wall of Fame in the Brain Injury Unit. Dr King also set up the Spasticity Clinic and is involved in teaching and outcomes research. Dr. King also provides clinical consultation to the Neurosurgery Service at Royal North Shore Hospital.



Nick Rushworth

Executive Officer, Brain Injury Australia (BIA)

BIA has partnered with Sports Medicine Australia to deliver a nationwide "grassroots" concussion education campaign, built around BIA's "5Rs" of concussion: Recognise the injury; Removal from play; Referral to a doctor; Rest; and Return to play. The initiative begins in June, with the production of a concussion education video for Australia's General Practitioners, to be presented by Dr. Michael Makdissi – a member of the international authority, the Concussion in Sport Group, and team doctor for the Australian Football League's 2014 premiership-winning Hawthorn Football Club premiership-winning Hawthorn Football Club.
